Did You Know?



- ▽ If a student qualifies for free/reduced Lunch, they also qualify for free/reduced Breakfast
- ▽ As a parent, you need to fill out a new application for free/reduced status every school year.
- ▽ You can even fill out a new free/reduce application every month if you are trying to qualify. We encourage this when employment is often seasonal.
- ▽ All School meals are strictly regulated and must meet Federal nutrition requirements. These requirements ensure that the meals are healthy and proportioned to meet the needs of different age children.

Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household incomes falls within the limits on this chart:

The National School Lunch Act requires the information on this application. You do not have to give the information, but if you do not, we cannot approve your children for free or reduced price meals. The Social Security Number of the adult household member who signs the application is required unless you list Food Stamp or W-2 cash benefits case numbers for all children you are applying for, OR if you are applying for a foster child. You must check the "I do not have a Social Security Number" box if the adult household member signing the application does not have a Social Security Number. We WILL use your information to see if your children are eligible for free or reduced price meals, to run the program, and to enforce the rules of the program. We MAY share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them evaluate, fund, or determine benefits for their programs, auditors for program reviews, and law enforcement officials to help them look into misuse of program rules.
